# Our Mission

to acquire the proficiency, expertise and experience necessary to compete, on an equal basis, for federally-assisted PennDOT highway contracts and subcontracts

# Why work with PennDOT?

- PennDOT awards over \$1 BILLION in contracts each year.
- Any project receiving federal funds has a DBE Goal.
- There are still many opportunities for SBEs who don't qualify as DBE or DB.
- **All Services Provided by the Supportive Centers are Free of Charge.**



# What is a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE)?

- Organized as a for-profit business.
- At least 51% owned by one or more socially and economically disadvantaged individuals who also control the firm.
- Owned by a U.S. citizen or lawfully permitted U.S. resident.



# What is DBE cont.?

- Owner's personal net worth less than \$1.32 million.
- Meets the Small Business Administration size standards.
- Three years average of business income does not exceed \$23.98 million.

# Service Delivery Goals

- Increase the number of READY-TO-WORK DBE firms available across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- Increase the percentage of READY-TO-WORK DBE firms receiving Subcontract Awards
- Increase the number of DBE firms who grow from Subcontractors to Primes
- Impact the DBE Goals on PennDOT Contract Awards

# Service Delivery Model

**Cohort 1**: Serviceable but not READY TO WORK

**Cohort 2**: READY TO WORK but not receiving PennDOT awards

**Cohort 3**: READY TO WORK and receiving PennDOT awards

# Serviceable does not mean....

That a DBE firm is

**READY-TO-WORK**

# READY-TO-WORK means...

The DBE firm appears on the ECMS website as a firm that is:

- “Qualified” as a Sub-Consultant
- “PreQualified” as a Sub-Contractor
- “Approved” as a Trucker, Supplier or Service Provider

# What is a Diverse Business ( DB)?

A minimum of 51 percent of the business must be owned and controlled by one of the these groups

- Woman-Owned Business
- Minority-Owned Business
- Veteran/Disabled Veteran-Owned Business

# Seeking SBE Certification?

- The SBE element is race and gender neutral.
- The Mission of the Small Business Enterprise Supportive Services Center (SBESSC) is to serve as a resource for assisting SBE firms in gaining access to FAA, FHWA, and FTA assisted, transportation-related contracts. The Center will also assist SBEs active in the transportation arena in becoming self-sufficient and achieving proficiency in order to compete on an equal basis with non SBEs.



# SBE Program Overview

- The purpose of the SBESSC is to remove barriers faced by all small businesses in an effort to increase their participation on federally-assisted transportation projects.
- SBEs will need to apply and be certified by the Department's Bureau of Equal Opportunity, unless they are currently certified as a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE).
- Firms currently certified as a DBE by PA UCP are eligible to participate in the SBE Element and DO NOT need to submit an SBE application.



# What is an SBE?

- A for-profit business owned by a United States citizen or lawfully admitted permanent resident of the United States.
- A firm that does not exceed the Small Business Administration's size standards for the work they desire to perform.
- A firm whose average annual gross receipts for the three previous fiscal years does not exceed \$23.98 million.
- All DBs and DBEs are automatically SBEs.
